#### **Mission Statement**

#### **Equal Rights Policy**

Trinity on the Hill Weekday Education admits students of any race, color, national and ethnic origin to all the rights, privileges, programs and activities generally accorded to or made available to students at the school. #### Philosophy

We believe that children are a gift from God and we are committed to loving and caring for each child. We want a child's first school experience to be exciting and pleasant in hopes they will in turn have a love of learning. We value parental involvement and encourage the sharing of talents and interests which enhance their school experiences. It is our desire that our children and families understand the importance of having Christ at the center of their life.



# ABCs and 123s: What's Appropriate?

Many parents are concerned when their children aren't practicing letters and numbers. They feel that completing paper and pencil exercises will most effectively prepare their child for elementary school.



Preschools could give your child workbooks

and make them memorize the alphabet. Your children could be drilled and tested. If preschools did operate this way, however, your children would lose something very important.

Children who are rushed into reading and writing too soon miss important steps in learning and may suffer later on because they lack the foundation they need for using language. Children who are taught to read before they are ready may be able to sound out and recognize words, but they may also have little understanding of what they are reading. If they haven't been given time to play, they won't have explored objects enough to know what words (like "hard, harder, hardest") mean. If they aren't allowed to string beads, button, dress up, cut, paste, pour, and draw, they won't develop the small muscle skills they need for writing.

Because math involves more than memorizing facts (such as 2+2=4) - because it involves logical thinking - children shouldn't be pushed into paper and pencil arithmetic too soon. To acquire the foundation for logical thinking, children need many opportunities to count objects, sort them into piles, add some to a pile, and take some away. It is by playing games like these that they will learn to understand what is meant by addition, subtraction, division and multiplication. Without concrete experiences, children may give correct answers but may not really understand what they are doing and why.

Probably, most important of all, if children are rushed into academic subjects too soon, they may lose their enthusiasm for learning as well as their sense of themselves as learners. If children are told what to learn and memorize by the teacher, they may become passive and dependent learners, unexcited about something new. Children who have had plenty of time to play, however, learn to ask their own questions and figure out their own answers. They are responsible for their own learning. They see themselves as explorers, discoverers, problem solvers and inventors.

Teacher to student ratio: 2 teachers to 10 students (with floater)
Days offered: Monday thru Friday, select any variety of open days

#### **Young Toddler Room**

Age range: 1 to 2 years old

Teacher to student ratio: 2 teachers to 10 students

Days offered: Monday thru Friday, select any variety of open days

#### **Older Toddler Room**

Age range: 1.5 to 2.5 years old

Teacher to student ratio: 2 teachers to 11 students

Days offered: Monday thru Friday, select any variety of open days

#### Young 2's Room

Age range: 2 to 2.5 years old (typically spring & summer birthdays)

Teacher to student ratio: 2 teachers to 12 students

Days offered: Monday thru Friday, select any variety of open days

#### Older 2's Room

Age range: 2.5 to 3 years old (typically fall & winter birthdays)

Teacher to student ratio: 2 teachers to 13 students

#### **3K Program**

Age Range: 3 to 4 years old

Teacher to student ratio: 2 teachers to 15 students

Classes offered: 5 day class (Mon thru Fri), 3 day/week option, 2 day/week option

#### **4K Program**

Age Range: 4 to 5 years old

Teacher to student ratio: 2 teachers to 16 students

Class offered: 5 day class (Mon thru Fri)

#### **Kindergarten Program**

Age range: 5 to 6 years old

Teacher to student ratio: 2 teachers to 14 students

Class offered: 5 day class (Mon thru Fri)



#### **Enrollment**

Registration for the following school year begins the third week in January. Trinity church members and families presently enrolled in our program may register at this time. The following week, registration is open to new families. A registration fee equal to one month's tuition is due at the time of registration. This fee is non-refundable unless you move from the Augusta area.

We also offer a summer program (Summer Fun) for children ages 6-months through rising kindergarteners. Registration for this program begins the last two weeks of March. Trinity church members and families currently enrolled in our regular school program will register first. Information and summer dates will be sent out via email and available on our website in early March.

#### Withdrawals

If it should be necessary to withdraw your child, please give the director at least one month's notice via email. You are responsible for the entire month's tuition if your child attends any part of the month or if one month's notice is not given.

#### **Fees**

Monthly fees, consisting of tuition and an activity fee, are paid on a ten-month schedule (Aug-May) and are due by the 15th of each month. A late fee of \$10 will be assessed if monthly fees are not paid by the due date. Outstanding balances in excess of 30 days may result in withdrawal from school. Special payment arrangements, if needed, can be made with the approval of the director. Monthly fees are not reduced due to illnesses, holidays, inclement weather, or national emergencies.

Payments may be made by cash, check (payable to Trinity on the Hill), ACH, or debit/credit card.\* A billing statement will be emailed to each family at the beginning of the month. You may remit your cash/check payment to the director or your child's teacher, or pay with ACH or credit/debit card through Procare, our child care management software. When paying by ACH or debit/credit card, you have the option to save your card information and authorize Trinity on the Hill Weekday Education to charge your card for future transactions. Should you choose to change your saved payment method or cancel the authorization to charge your saved card, you may do so with your Procare login on the mobile app or on the web . Procare is where you can view your account balance, invoices, and payment history, as well as make payments. You can access statements and tax receipts by clicking the 'Statements' and 'Tax Statement' buttons. More information on Procare can be found on page 6.



### **Procare Solutions**

Our online platform for registration, communication, billing, reenrollment, and so much more!

The Procare website and app have the same functionality but are accessed in different ways:

**<u>Procare website</u>** – Accessed through a web browser at schools.procareconnect.com



#### Parent App – Download through your app store





- 1. Upon enrollment, you will receive an email from Trinity on the Hill inviting you to create an account with Procare. Follow the link in the email to create your account.
- 2. Set up your payment method upon receiving your first invoice if you choose to pay with debit card, credit card or ACH account. Click "Make Payment". Click "Set up my payment method." Choose one of the options and enter payment information.
  - \*\*Cash & Check payments can be sent into the Weekday Education office. Checks should be written to "Trinity on the Hill".\*\*
- 3. Once payment method is set up, you can choose for Autopay to be activated. Simply click the grey circle to the left of "Autopay on". Autopay is on when the circle is blue. Once autopay is activated, your card will be charged for tuition fees on the 15th of each month, August thru May.

#### Communication

It is very important that there be good communication with parents, teachers, and the director. If you need to get a message to the teacher or the director, use the communication tool in Procare or send an email. Our staff emails can be found in Appendix B. A newsletter with upcoming events and other information will be emailed weekly to all of our families from the director's office and you will be hearing weekly from your child's teachers. Please take the time to read these notes to stay informed.

If you have classroom concerns, please contact your child's teacher to set up a time to meet or have a phone conference. It is very difficult to give special attention to concerns during school hours, especially during morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up.

#### **School Schedule**

Trinity on the Hill Weekday Education is from 9:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M., Monday thru Friday, during the school year (August thru May).

The 2025-2026 school schedule can be found in Appendix A.

### School Closures Due to Circumstances Beyond Our Control

Please know if we make the decision to close our school or certain classrooms due to circumstances beyond our control, it is in the best interest of our staff, students, and families.

- If there is a government mandate to close schools/childcare centers, we will close.
- In the event of a temporary school closure, learn from home resources will be provided and a full tuition payment is expected.
- In the event of a long-term school closure, tuition options will be evaluated at that time.

# **Drop Off and Pick Up**

# **Babies, Toddlers and 2-Year Olds**

Children in these classrooms are dropped off and picked up in their designated classrooms in the Preschool Building or on the small playground. A late fee will be charged to your monthly invoice when children are not picked up by 1:00 P.M.


# PreK-3, PreK-4 and Kindergarten

Children in these classrooms are dropped off and picked up in carline (see map below). The morning carline begins at 9:00 A.M. and ends at 9:10 A.M. If morning carline has ended, the parent must accompany their child to either the Preschool Building side door or to the PreK-4/Kindergarten drop off location. The afternoon carline begins at 12:45 P.M. and ends at 1:00 P.M. We appreciate your promptness as teachers may have afternoon appointments or other responsibilities. A late few will be charged if your child is not picked up by 1:00 P.M.

Always put your car in park when dropping off and picking up children. Children must exit and enter through the driver's side of the car. Teachers will open car doors and help your child out of the car and to their classroom. We ask that you stay in your car so the line will move along and not become congested. If you need to talk to your child's teacher, please park in a space. For safety reasons, neither children nor teachers will walk in front of or behind cars.

PLEASE NOTE: Your child's teacher is not allowed to buckle up your child.

The car pool line is a no cell phone zone.



# **Health & Safety at School**

#### **Overall Health Protocols**

We make every effort to provide a safe and healthy environment for your child. Your child will need to have all necessary immunizations which are due before your child begins classes. Forms can be turned in to your child's teacher or the director. (GA Department of Human Resources Form 3231) All forms must be signed, dated



and include expiration date. If your child has any allergies, this needs to be indicated on their Procare profile.

No over the counter or prescription medicines will be administered at school with the exception of EpiPens and inhalers, see next page for protocol.

If your child has chronic sinus problems or seasonal allergies, the director needs to have a physician's statement so we know that your child is not contagious to other children.

Please do not send your child to school if he/she has any of the following symptoms:

- 1. A contagious disease (chicken pox, flu, cold, stomach virus, COVID-19).
- 2. A fever (free of any fever without the help of medication for 24 hours before returning to school)
- 3. Nasal drainage with any color, for whatever reason (teething, sinus infection, colds). Only clear drainage is permitted if there is no other sign of illness. Please treat excessive drainage.
- 4. Chest congestion, persistent cough, or rattling breathing sounds.
- 5. Unusual fretful or irritable behavior.
- 6. Unknown rash.
- 7. Diarrhea or vomiting (free of any signs for 24 hours before returning to school).
- 8. Eye drainage of any kind.
- 9. Active lice and/or nits (lice eggs). We are a nit free school.
- 10. Sores from Hand, Foot & Mouth disease and Impetigo must be healed/scabbed over before returning to school.

#### Sick at School

If your child becomes ill during the day or overly fussy, parents will be notified. In the event that parents cannot be contacted, those listed on your emergency pick up will be called. Pick up arrangements must be made immediately and children picked up within 1 hour. For this reason, it is imperative that our contact numbers are both local and current. Please advise all persons designated to pick up your sick child that they would be expected to pick up children when notified of a child's illness.

## **Allergies**

If your child has any food allergies, please make sure you have discussed these with your child's teacher and included that information on their Procare profile. Any serious allergies need to be discussed with the director before the child enters school. We do allow EpiPens on campus for children with sever allergies—see EpiPen guidelines below.

# **EpiPen & Inhaler Guidelines**

Trinity on the Hill Weekday Education recognizes that there are students who have allergies and/ or breathing conditions that may require the use of an EpiPen or inhaler. Such allergies/conditions may include but are not limited to certain foods, insects, medications, latex and/or asthma. The following policy & procedures have been established for parents and students for the use of an EpiPen or inhaler during Trinity on the Hill Weekday Education school hours.

- All student allergies must be included upon registration for the upcoming school year and/or Summer Fun program. The school must be updated immediately if there are changes in the student allergies on file.
- A Student Anaphylaxis Action Plan and Authorization (SAAPA) form is to be filled out and signed for each school year and is to include an updated picture of the student. Form is provided by the Weekday Education Director.
- The parent is to supply the school with one or two EpiPens or inhalers. EpiPens or inhalers will be stored in the preschool office for Early Childhood & PreK-3 aged students and in the children's hallway kitchen OR in the child's specific classroom for PreK-4 and Kindergarten aged students. EpiPens and inhalers will be stored in a medical lock box with a 3-digit code in both locations. The 3-digit code will be given only to those administrators and teachers who have been trained and authorized to use EpiPens and inhalers.
- Per state law, the EpiPen and inhalers should be brought to school in original, pharmacy labeled container. The container shall display: student name, prescription number, medication name and dosage, administration route or other directions, date, licensed prescriber's name, and pharmacy name, address, and phone number.
- As age appropriate, students should be instructed in the use of their EpiPen or inhaler by their
  physician and parent on a yearly basis. The SAAPA form will indicate if the child has received
  instruction in self-administration.
- The Weekday Education Director, Weekday Education Assistant Director and any teachers
  with a child in their classroom who has a SAAPA form on file will receive yearly training by a
  licensed medical professional on how to properly administer an EpiPen and inhaler.
  Documentation of trained and authorized staff members will be kept on file in the Weekday
  Education Office.
- Upon use of an EpiPen, 911 (EMS service) will be immediately called and the student will be transported to a local emergency room for further treatment and observation. Parents will be contacted as soon as possible and informed of student's allergic reaction, use of EpiPen and transportation to an emergency facility. Upon use of an inhaler, parents will be immediately notified and 911 (EMS service) may be called if breathing issues continue.

## Safe Sanctuary Policy

The Safe Sanctuary Policy at Trinity on the Hill requires periodic background checks and training for <u>all</u> employees and volunteers who work with children. Employee background checks are completed every two years.

#### **Inclement Weather at School**

Should severe weather occur during the school day, teachers will text or email you with instructions. Contact the school if you have any questions.

## We Lock Up!

For the safety of our children, we keep the doors locked at all times. Please ring the bell and a staff member will meet you at the door. If your PreK-4 or Kindergarten student arrives late, he/she should enter Flanagan Hall through the glass double doors accompanied by a parent. Contact your child's teacher to meet you in the lobby. We encourage parents to arrive at school on time. When children are late they miss out on many special experiences. It can also be stressful for younger children with separation problems when parents arrive late.

# **Afternoon Pick Up**

Only a parent or emergency contact as noted in your child's profile may pick up your child from school. If you wish to have someone pick up your child who has not been previously authorized, please contact your child's teacher in writing in advance. If a change arises after the school day begins, please call the director and leave a message. It is best if you call before 12:00 P.M. to ensure that the message is given to the teacher. You can update your child's emergency contact list at anytime on your child's Procare profile.

# **Classroom Information**

# **Birthdays and Celebrations**

Birthdays are very special to children and we like to help celebrate this occasion. Please notify your child's teacher several days in advance if you would like to bring in a small treat to help celebrate. Ask your child's teacher for ideas for age appropriate treats to bring and if there are any allergies. If your child wishes to invite classmates to his or her birthday party, invitations should be mailed unless the whole class is invited, please.

Holiday parties will be celebrated. Teachers will send out information or you will be contacted by the classroom moms.

# **Field Trips**

Throughout the year the Pre-K 4 and Kindergarten children will attend field trips to various places of interest. A parent must complete a permission form for each trip. We will ask parents to help with transportation and to accompany us. Parent drivers are required to provide a copy of their driver's license, proof of insurance and authorize the school to obtain a Motor Vehicle Report if they are driving children other than their own. Parents accompanying the class on trips are asked to please leave other siblings in someone else's care during the trip. Most field trips are covered by the activity fee.

## **Chapel Time**

Weekly, our 2-year olds, Pre-K 3, Pre-K 4 and Kindergarten children attend Chapel. The children enjoy a short devotion along with prayer and singing, led by Mrs. Elizabeth Jones. This is also a time that we reinforce the Bible verses that we are learning.

#### **Missions**

"I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of Mine, you did for Me."
- Matthew 25:40

We feel that it is very important to teach our children to have compassion for others. The children will have the opportunity to take part in different missions throughout the school year. More information on these wonderful and worthwhile projects will be sent home during the school year.

#### Lunch

Your child will need to bring a nutritious lunch to school each day along with a drink. Please keep lunches simple so that your child can easily feed himself/herself. Desserts should be a special treat and should not be a daily part of your child's diet. Your child will not be allowed to eat a dessert unless a healthy lunch has first been eaten. Please make sure that your child's name is on his/her lunchbox as well as all non-disposable containers. Please send plastic spoons or other utensils if needed. Lunches cannot be heated at school. You will be notified if your child's class is peanut/tree nut free due to a severe allergy.

# Discipline

The only disciplinary measure used at Trinity on the Hill Weekday Education is "timeout" in the classroom or in the director's office with the director. If the problem persists or is severe, parents will be called to pick up their child. Issues pertaining to excessive aggression and/or behavior that results in safety issues for teachers and children in our program may result in expulsion from Trinity on the Hill Weekday Education.

# Biting

Biting is normal and natural for young children. Nearly every child bites another child at some time. Usually, when children bite, it is because they lack the skills to cope with frustrating situations (such as wanting a toy that another child has) or have limited language skills. We handle biting by redirecting the biter to another activity and close supervision.

When an incident occurs, teachers notify parents of the bitten child as well as parents of the child who bit. Biting incidents are handled in the classroom by the teacher as a normal part of the young child's life. However, when chronic biting incidents escalate or persist to the detriment of others in the classroom, expulsion from Trinity on the Hill Weekday Education may occur.

#### Children with Disabilities

We value and accept all children here at Trinity on the Hill Weekday Education. However, there are times when the developmental, physical, and/or social-emotional needs of a child may be beyond our scope of training and enrollment at Trinity may not be in the best interest of the child. These situations will be handled on a case-by-case basis.

# **Parent Involvement**

Parents have the opportunity to become involved in school activities by serving as Room Parents, Mystery Reader, Parents in Prayer, or class field trips. You will have an opportunity to sign up as a volunteer at Open House.

# **Mystery Readers**

Parents can sign up to read in their child's room (for Pre-K 3, Pre-K 4, or Kindergarten classes) as a surprise visitor. See your child's teacher for more details and dates available. This is a special treat for the children and you'll be blessed as well.

#### **Substitutes**

We are always looking for parents to substitute when our teachers are out. If you are interested in being on our substitute teacher list, please contact the director. This is a fun way to get involved and see what goes on in the classroom. All substitute teachers must consent to a background check and complete an online child safety training before they are allowed to work in the classroom.

# **Enrichment for Our Children**

<u>Playground</u>- Each class, beginning with Toddlers through Kindergarten, will have a daily playground time. Please dress your child in comfortable clothing and proper shoes. The gym is available for days when we experience inclement weather. Apply sunscreen/bug spray before school if necessary.

\*\*NEW\*\* Literacy Program - Our 2-year olds through Kindergarten will meet weekly with Mrs. Stephanie Rogers for our newest specials class where they will hear classic stories and develop a love and appreciation for storytelling & reading.

<u>Spanish-</u> Our 2-year olds through Kindergarten meet weekly with Mrs. Stephanie Rogers to learn basic Spanish.

<u>Music</u>— Our 2-year olds through Kindergarten meet weekly with Mrs. Stephania Rogers for singing, listening, movement and rhythm activities to bring out the music in every child.

<u>Wiggle Worms</u>- Twice a month, our Preschool and Kindergarten classes attend a fun, fitness class in the gym. During class, children warm up to music and participate in dancing, movement activities, relays, and running. During this time, we are also working on gross motor skills like hopping on one foot, jumping, catching, and running. Healthy habits are also discussed.

<u>School Pictures</u>- Individual pictures are taken in the fall (November) and both individual and group pictures in the spring (March). You will be notified of the dates for pictures several weeks in advance. Pictures are taken by Carter Koenig Photography.

Georgia law mandates that children under the age of 24-months may not attend school more than two days a week. In our two's class we have objectives that guide teachers as they prepare children for our preschool program.


